

EndNote rebranding

“EndNote Web” is no longer the name for the referencing software EndNote’s online version.

There used to be three types of EndNote Web account, Thomson Reuters have decide to simplify this. So there will now be:-

“EndNote” - the desktop product plus access to a full online account and “EndNote Basic” - a FREE online account with some features reduced but this will now have up to 2GB for attachments.

The University is no longer purchasing new editions of EndNote for the

desktop—although the last version, X5 is still available on the network (Start Menu -> General Applications -> EndNote X5).

where a free account can be set up for EndNote Basic (i.e. what used to be EndNote Web). We suspect that that URL may change but for the moment it’s working.



Discovery

Have you discovered Discovery yet?

If you’re pointing students to our information resources (books, ebooks, journals or articles), don’t forget that they can now click on the green link ‘Discovery Service’ (in the search widget on the top right of the Library homepage).

This will return results from the Library Catalogue, our ebook collections and many of our major databases. In fact it finds so many items for most searches that one of the first things to note is how to refine a search on the left hand side of the results page! (One option is ‘full text’ only).
