

## RFID Going Ahead

During the summer the University Library will be introducing RFID based self-service for our circulation services such as the issue and return of books and audio-visual resources. This will enable us to move staff from transactional activities to engaging more directly with academic staff and students at the point of need through provision of services such as roaming support and a Welcome Desk. We anticipate that these new ways of interacting with the users will enhance the user experience. RFID will also enable us to simplify many standard collection management tasks such as finding missing or mis-shelved items in the Library and stock checking giving a much more accurate catalogue to the benefit of all users. It is anticipated that we will be going live with this service in September. ## Journal Weeding

During this summer the Library will be undertaking a weeding exercise on the science and technology print journal collections, based on usage statistics, to allow us to create additional study spaces for students on the ground floor of the Library. We are focusing our attention initially on the science and technology journals due to the high availability and use of electronic journals in this area with an accompanying decline in use of the print journals which has resulted in almost 48% of the journals on the ground floor not being used since October 2007. Similar exercises on the other floors of the Library will take place in summer 2013.
