

## Struggling with BS?

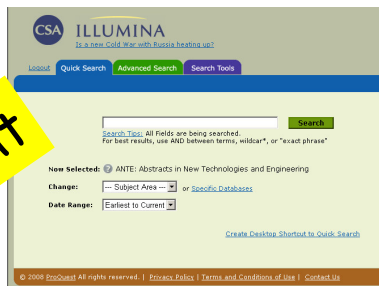
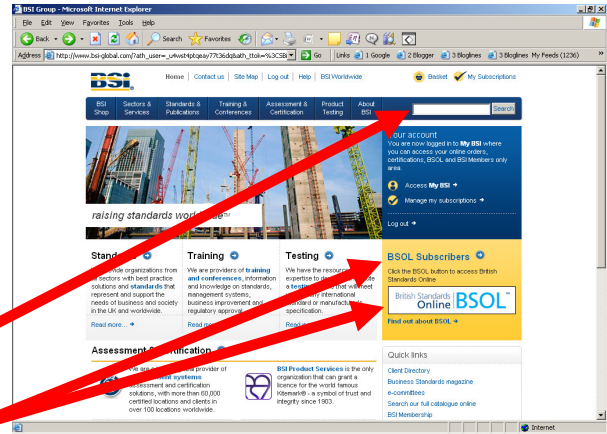
British Standards Online seem to cause more problems than most databases. Possibly because of a somewhat unintuitive front page.

The problems start when you search for a Standard in the box helpfully labelled 'Search'. This is only a site search, not a search of the actual database.

Login first using either of the links further down the page. And then click on those links again in order to perform a search. As usual, give Andy, Sue or Timothy a call if there are any problems.

## ANTE: Abstracts in New Technologies and Engineering

ANTE is one of the databases tucked away in CSA (Cambridge Scientific Abstracts) and can be searched with all the other Technology databases or on it's own if desired. (Click on 'Specific Databases').

ANTE covers medical technology, biotechnology, communications engineering, computers, construction, electrical engineering, science and measurement.

Articles date from 1981 but over 50% date from 1991. Some 20,000 articles are added ever year. (2.25 million records as of last month).

Just one result for the search "cup final":

No author. (2005). 'It's a goal: unbiased refereeing in football'

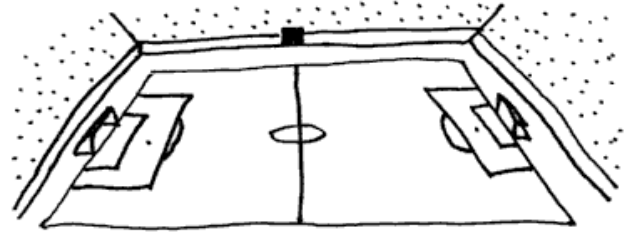
