Use the **Discovery** service and click on the **Publications** link (top left). Enter the journal name. If the journal is not found, use on the **Catalogue** search box on the **Library website**. Enter the journal name (select 'Journals and Serials' under 'Collection') to check for print journals.

If you have a **reading list**, the name of the journal is normally written in *italics*.

From the **Library website**, click on the **'Click to search Library resources'** button and then use the **Library Catalogue search box**. Type the database name in the search box.

From the **Library website**, use the **Discovery** service (top right-hand corner of the homepage), which is a search engine designed to help you find journal articles and other academic material by searching many of the library's databases in a single search. Alternatively, click on **My Subject** and select a subject covering your topic. Click on **Other Key Resources** to see recommended databases.

Obtain a copy of the journal article from the **Interlibrary loans** service.

Once you have accessed the Database you want, think carefully about the **keywords** you are going to use. The Advanced search screen will help you to narrow your search. Ask your **Faculty Librarian** for advice on your search strategy. Look at **Accessing Electronic Resources** under **Help & Support** if you

You may need to select 'UK Access Management Federation' and/or 'University of Portsmouth' from the list of organisations.

Locate the journal in the Library using the **shelfmark** details on the **Library catalogue**.

Click on the link to access the supplier's journal archive. Select the year, volume, and issue number. The journal article should appear in the list. Look for the link to the full-text or PDF version.

From off campus, you must look for the link to Shibboleth (also called Institutional Login or UK Federation). Enter your institutional login (your university username and password) in the University of Portsmouth login box.
